



Although exercising this right may impact certain learning opportunities and learning experiences that are part of their group’s program, the student will continue to receive educational services. To learn more about what changes a refusal may bring, please speak with your school principal.

The CSB will use minimal student personal information to provide access to CSB-approved platforms unless a refusal is communicated.

3. What Information May Be Used and Why

Only necessary personal information may be used to provide student access to platforms.

<i>Information</i>	<i>Why it is required</i>
Student first and last name	To identify the student account
School email address and password	To log in securely and identify the student within the Board’s systems
School, grade level & homeroom group	To assign the correct content, classes, and teachers

Under no circumstances will the Board share sensitive information, such as date of birth, permanent codes, or medical information, with educational platforms.

4. How Platforms Are Reviewed

The CSB’s Department of Digital Learning conducts a rigorous platform review process, notably through its Policy on Digital Learning Platforms in the Youth Sector (EDU-19) (accessible through this QR code). This includes:



- verification of compliance with applicable legislation and alignment with the CSB’s and Quebec’s education programs;
- verification of consistency with the CSB’s values;
- verification that the platform does not sell or use student personal information for marketing purposes;
- verification that the platform does not use identifiable student personal information to train Artificial Intelligence models

The review process ensures that personal information collection is limited to what is needed to enable use of the platform.

Approved platforms are frequently verified. Any platform that no longer meets these standards is removed or suspended.

5. Your Rights

You have the right to:

- Request details on what information is collected and how it may be used
- Request that your child's personal information not be used by platforms

6. How to Withdraw Consent for the Use of Personal Information (Opt-Out)

Platforms are part of classroom instruction and will be used unless you object. If you wish to withdraw your consent for the use of your child's personal information from platforms, you must contact the school principal.

Your child will continue to receive educational services even if consent is withdrawn. However, it will impact certain learning opportunities and limit access to some digital learning platforms that are part of the learning program.

PARENTAL AND GUARDIAN CONSENT

Considering the nature of the personal information needed for the use of certain digital learning platforms;

Considering the security measures in place by the CSB, notably through its Policy on Digital Learning Platforms in the Youth Sector (EDU-19);

Considering the educational use of platforms detailed in this Notice;

Considering the information provided to you in this Notice;

You are hereby informed that minimal personal information from your child might be used within platforms approved by the CSB for the school year. If you do not wish for your child's personal information to be used, you must notify the school principal as soon as possible.

Please note that withdrawing your consent could prevent your child from participating in certain classroom activities and learning experiences that are part of their group's educational program.
