Long and Short Vowel Sounds

Instructions: Read the word and listen for the vowel sound. Choose if it makes a short vowel sound or a long vowel sound, and colour in the correct bubble.

Hint:

These letters are vowels: **a, e, i, o, u** (and sometimes y).

Each vowel can make **2 sounds**, a long sound and a short sound.

When a vowel has a long sound, it says its name.

i → i gloo	i → i gloo
o → o ctopus	o → o ctopus
u → u mbrella	u → u mbrella
