Helping your child talk During everyday activities



Activity: Hide and Seek!

Skills: following directions, remembering, vocabulary.

Materials: small objects, stickers, small toys.

Instructions:

- Ask your child to close his eyes.
- Hide a small object or a sticker around the room (e.g. under a chair, in a bag, in a drawer).
- Tell your child where to look. For example:
 - o **Easy**: It's on my bed.
 - o **Medium**: It's beside the garbage can.
 - Difficult: It's in the second drawer of your dresser.
- If you are in the bush, hide something outside.
- Take turns with your child.

Tip: You can help your child understand by using pictures or acting out what you're saying.

Use Pictures:

- Say the word and show a picture.
 - Show a picture on your phone, make a drawing (if you're artistic!), or use flashcards (see next page).

Use Gestures:

Say the word and act it out (use a gesture) at the same time.
 (e.g. act out opening a <u>drawer</u>, or pretend to put something <u>under</u> an object near you.)
