

2) Elementary Level

[6 years old](#)

2.1. Any student who will be 6 years old on September 30 of any given school year must be placed in Grade 1.

2.2. The cycle team recommends the promotion of a student, taking into consideration the student's acquisition of the competencies related to the program of study, but especially in relation to the student's abilities in language of instruction, mathematics, and Cree language, where offered. Regardless of the configuration of the classes in the school, students are promoted by cycle in elementary school and not by year; a student may be required to remain one more year in a given cycle under the following conditions:

- a) after proper intervention measures have not been successful and with proper documentation;
- b) only once during the elementary;
- c) only at the end of a cycle.

Each promotion decision has to be made in the best interest of the student and is subject to section 3.1 below.

3) Secondary Level

3.1. Any student who will be 13 years old on September 30 of any given school year must be placed into Secondary level.

3.2. Secondary students will be considered for promotion by the cycle team, only if they meet the following conditions:

- a) For promotion in Secondary II to III, and III to IV success in:
 - i. mother tongue
 - ii. second language
 - iii. Mathematics
- b) For promotion from Secondary IV to V, success in:
 - i. mother tongue
 - ii. second language
 - iii. Mathematics¹
 - iv. Science and Technology²
 - v. Québec and Canada History and Citizenship

and If the student has achieved 16 MEES credits;

- c) Graduation from Secondary V is determined by MEES regulations and official MEES transcripts (54 credits in Secondary IV or Secondary V must be accumulated out of which at least 20 credits must be obtained at the Secondary V level).

¹ Schools must offer mathematics and or Science and Technology course(s) to secondary 5 students who did not succeed in secondary 4.

3.3. For secondary level, success means a final mark of 60% or higher. However, a student who receives a mark of 58% or 59% will be considered to have obtained a 60% and the mark on the report should reflect this.
