




THE CREE SCHOOL BOARD STRATEGIC ACTION PLAN 2021-2026

The Cree School Board (CSB) has taken a unique opportunity and prepared the new 2021-2026 Strategic Action Plan (SAP) that reflects the vision for student success and provides a practical “game plan” for moving forward with confidence, guided by three

themes/objectives. The new SAP was created through an inclusive, extensive consultative process that included CSB employees from all departments, as well as education partners and stakeholders in the Cree Nation.



SAP Highlights:

- Creating Cree resources using Cree elders to support employees.
- Creating the Eeyou-lihtuwin Department and Cree language positions to support the department.
- Creating the Director of Eeyou lihtuwin position will lead the department and be based in Chisasibi.
- With the new SAP, Cree language, culture, and worldview are at the centre of everything we do.
- Cree Component is connected with the new Cree School Board’s 2021-2026 Strategic Action Plan, focusing on the Eeyou lihtuwin pillar.

“This SAP reflects our shared ideas, values, and hopes for the CSB. It is a testament to what we can achieve through teamwork, a student-centred approach, and above all, a strong commitment to who we are as Eeyouch/Eenouch,” said Director General Caroline Mark.

The SAP used the analogy of preparing for a traditional hunt: assessing the current environment and surroundings (i.e., wind, temperature, etc.), thinking where you want to go on the trap line, and then coming up with a hunting strategy.

“It is wonderful to see how focused this SAP is on promoting Cree customs, practices, and a worldview at the CSB. To fulfill the promise of the JBNQA, our cultural identity must be at the centre of everything we do as a school board,” said Chairperson Dr. Sarah Pash.

The SAP will be implemented board-wide by phases.

Annie Spencer-Otter submitted this essay as part of her English assignment in the Iyescuwiiu Program, which is an in-community Springboard to Diploma College Studies program offered by the Sabtuan Adult Education Services in collaboration with John Abbott College, here is what she wrote:

Since 2016, Lucas Spencer-Otter has had a passion to save lives and help community members reach their fitness goals.

Lucas Spencer-Otter, my brother, is 22 years old and was born and raised in Chisasibi, Quebec. He has positively impacted the community by working as a lifeguard and a personal trainer when those roles were greatly needed in Chisasibi.

Lucas had the opportunity to become a lifeguard when he was offered free courses while attending high school. Starting the lifeguard job sparked his health and fitness journey. Due to the unexpected closure of the pool, Lucas got transferred from working as a lifeguard to working as a personal trainer, based on his

interest in physical fitness. He was certified as a personal trainer at the Chisasibi Fitness Centre through Trevor Monaghan's training course. He has helped both youth and adults to reach their fitness goals by guiding them through their workout, while making sure they do so safely.

Lucas proudly admitted to saving a couple of young people's lives and shares, "if it's foreseeable, it's preventable." Lucas had also inspired many to start and maintain their fitness journeys.

"Anyone is capable of living a healthy lifestyle. Just start off by making small changes to your eating habits and going for 10-minute walks," he said.


